

# Make Your VOTING PLAN

## City of Omaha General Election – May 11, 2021

The primary is over but the election is not and every vote counts. Whether you're mailing in your ballot or heading to the polls to vote in person, plan ahead and vote! A voting plan is exactly that—figuring out how and when you will vote ahead of Election Day. Making a plan early will help to avoid running into any challenges later. If we've learned anything from the past year—it's that we need to be prepared and plan ahead!

### ARE YOU ELIGIBLE TO VOTE?

- I am a U.S. Citizen.
- I am 18 years or older on Election Day (May 11, 2021).
- I live in Douglas County, Nebraska.

*If you checked all the boxes, you are eligible!\**

\*If you were convicted of a felony, your voting rights are restored after two years. See [here](#) for more information.

### ARE YOU CURRENTLY REGISTERED TO VOTE IN NEBRASKA?

*The deadline to [register to vote](#) online in the General Election is April 23, sooner if you plan to register by mail.*

### DO YOU HAVE A PLAN FOR HOW YOU ARE GOING TO VOTE?

There are three possible ways!

#### Vote by Mail or Dropbox

Applications for Early Voting ballots must be received by the county election office by **April 30 at 6 p.m.**

Return your ballot to the county election office by **May 11 before 8 p.m.**

*We recommend dropping your ballot in [a ballot drop box.](#)*

*You can also return your ballot by mail.*

#### Vote Early in Person

Know [where your election office is](#) so you can vote early in person.

Set a [date and time you will vote](#) **between April 26 and May 11.**

Make sure you can take time off work, have child care or plan to bring your child with you.

Find public transportation or other ways to get to your election office.

#### Vote on Election Day

Schedule a time on **May 11** to vote.
